The Radiation Therapy program at Baptist Health Sciences University is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT). Students successfully completing all medical radiography degree requirements will receive a Bachelor of Health Sciences (BHS) degree with a major in medical radiography and can become candidates to sit for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) Radiography (R) certification examination. Graduates who have successfully completed the required Computed Tomography and Magnetic resonance didactic courses and seek further clinical competencies can also be candidates for the ARRT (CT) and ARRT (MR) registry after passing the ARRT Radiography (R) certification examination. Additional requirements for licensure may be required by the state in which you practice.
